## **Changing the Zoning Ordinance, Overlay Districts and Extraterritorial Jurisdiction**

Understanding the process for amending zoning ordinances, and the notice required to do so, can be helpful to counties and landowners. Jim will highlight the procedural requirements necessary to modify the ordinance. Overlay districts provide an additional layer of land use regulation. Jim will provide an overview of how overlay districts impact land use. Finally, extraterritorial, or "fringe", jurisdiction gives cities and towns the ability to control land use through zoning up to two miles (and sometimes more) from their municipal boundaries. Jim will explain this process.
