Agricultural Contracting – The Basics Todd Janzen, *Janzen Schroeder Ag Law*

Historically, some have avoided written contracts believing they convey a lack of trust between the parties, while others see value in clearly memorializing a "meeting of the minds" and documenting the duties and responsibilities of the parties to an agreement. All of these projects start with a contract between the property owner and the renewable energy company. Once a sufficient number of property owners have signed up, the project may move forward with permitting, financing, and development phases. Given the lengthy term and complexity of these contracts, landowners must fully understand the agreements put before them. These proposed contracts can be negotiated, so Indiana families should be ready to discuss their primary concerns and position their land for success now and into the future. Brianna will highlight common terms associated with renewable energy projects.
