# **Event Information**

#### **Hotel accommodations**

Convention registration does not include a hotel reservation. Attendees must reserve hotel rooms on their own. Indiana Farm Bureau does NOT reserve hotel rooms for delegates.

Due to the popularity of French Lick and West Baden - and our 100th Anniversary Celebration - we are offering four hotel options this year. A complimentary shuttle to and from the French Lick Springs Event Center will be available between all hotels. Shuttle times will be posted near the convention registration desk. The deadline for hotel reservations is Nov. 11 or until room blocks are sold out.

If you call to make a reservation, be sure to use the group code 1219INF and identify yourself as a Farm Bureau convention attendee to take advantage of the discounted rate of \$139 per night (plus tax).

<u>Comfort Suites French Lick</u>: 1-812-936-5000, 9350 West SR 56, French Lick. The discounted rate is \$129 per night (plus tax) and inlcudes breakfast. Be sure to mention Indiana Farm Bureau when making your reservation.

<u>Best Western Plus French Lick</u>: 1-812-936-0520, 613 South Arnold F. Habig Blvd., French Lick. The discounted rate is \$143 per night (plus tax) and includes breakfast. Make sure to request the INFB annual convention rate when making your reservation.

Please note, we will not have a closing lunch as we have in the past. The convention will adjourn at noon on Saturday, Dec. 14 after the closing general session.
