Teacher Answer Key

Encourage students to discover careers that may interest them. Examples of forestry careers are: arborist, architect, environmental educator, forester, forest engineer, logger, lumber mill worker, park ranger, policy advisor, soil scientist, sustainability manager, wildland firefighter or wildlife biologist.

Have students share one of their careers after research has been concluded.

Once students have solved this activity, they receive the lumber puzzle piece.

Background Information:

- Indiana is #1 in wooden furniture, kitchen cabinets and hardwood flooring.
- Indiana ranks sixth in the nation in lumber manufacturing.
- Dubois County is the top county for lumber production in the state.
- Lumber production in Indiana employs over 56,000 people.
- The United States uses 28% of the earth's lumber production.
- Most forest land is in Alaska.
- More than 750 million acres of the United States is covered in forest land.
